Boiler Upgrade Scheme opens

As you know, changing how we heat and insulate our homes is a very important priority for me and my fellow councillors, and of course it is particularly important now with huge hikes in the cost of energy.

The Leader of the District Council, Cllr David Rouane, has written to the government calling for a strategy for mass-retrofitting of homes – the second letter the Council has written to the government on this.

He has said that any plan should empower local authorise and ensure constant and long-term funding to ensure they can make sustained, significant progress in reducing greenhouse gas emissions from residential properties.

There is a new scheme just announced by the government:

The Boiler Upgrade Scheme which is to help improve the energy efficiency of homes, reduce energy bills and cut emissions in the long-term. The scheme is now open for people to apply for the following support when replacing their oil or gas boilers:

- £5,000 off the cost and installation of an air source heat pump
- £5,000 off the cost and installation of a biomass boiler
- £6,000 off the cost and installation of a ground source heat pump You can find out more about the scheme via **the government's website**, look up 'boiler upgrade scheme'
