### **1. Minutes of the last Annual Parish Meeting**


The minutes of the last Annual Parish Meeting were taken as read and approved.

### **2. Annual report of the Parish Council**

A number of items were briefly discussed.

- Mandy Rigault reported that the Village Hall Committee has said that the Parish Council is the main user of the Village Hall broadband so the Committee is perfectly happy if the Council takes the cheapest of the options for a new agreement with TalkTalk Business.
- Madhvi Saini said the Parish Council needs to find a volunteer to look after the new defibrillator. The Clerk said he already looks after a defibrillator for another parish and would be willing to do the same for this one.
- John Peters confirmed that he has displayed a notice in the noticeboard advertising a vacancy on the Parish Council.
- John Peters said he would take part in the online consultation event on 1<sup>st</sup> April regarding the proposed new solar farm at Burcot Farm. He and Madhvi Saini both said they would like to take up the developer's offer of a site visit.
