

## **Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting 2022**

The 2022 Annual Parish Meeting took place in the Village Hall on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2022.

Madhvi Saini, Chair of the Parish Council, opened the meeting at 7.09pm.

Present: eight parishioners (including all four members of the Parish Council) and the Parish Clerk.

### **1. Minutes of the last Annual Parish Meeting**

The minutes of the last Annual Parish Meeting were taken as read and approved.

### **2. Annual report of the Parish Council**

Madhvi Saini had prepared an annual report on behalf of the Parish Council.

Everyone took part in a full discussion about the gravel extraction site. Members of the parish council described how the Council worked with other individuals and organisations to overturn Oxfordshire County Council's initial decision to make Nuneham Courtenay the main source of its future need for gravel.

Next, the parishioners discussed the new solar farm. It was explained that only during construction the speed limit would be extended as far as Nineveh Farm. It was feared that there might be proposals for another solar farm on part of the Nuneham estate.

Members of the parish council then explained the threat to the village from the Housing Infrastructure Fund 1 road that would enable increased traffic to travel between the A34 at Milton and the Golden Balls roundabout.

Parishioners complained about the recent changes to the X39/40 bus route that used to go into Oxford past Redbridge Park and Ride and now goes instead along Iffley Road.

Mandy Rigault offered to try to organise a meeting in the Village Hall with the County Council. Two parishioners offered to help.

Parishioners complained about inconsistency from South Oxfordshire District Council with respect to planning decisions.

Parishioners were advised that Akshay Morye had created an excellent presentation regarding the peafowl petition which he had circulated to all the party leaders.
