## **Local Government Reorganisation**

Green Party councillor, Andrea Powell, brought a motion to a special full council meeting last month on local government reorganisation.

The motion asked the Council leader to write to the Electoral Commission and the Minister regarding concerns over the electoral governance for Mayors – citing that the first past the post voting system the Conservative government brought in for Mayors and the high financial threshold for campaigns and deposits risked undemocratic and skewed outcomes that do not represent the areas fairly.

The motion was voted down, with all the LibDems voting against as well as other councillors, despite the fact that similar motions were passed by LibDems in other councils in Oxfordshire.

This was an odd outcome, as so many said they supported the sentiment but thought it wasn't the right time to have a motion on this!

I struggle to think of a better time to discuss accountability and democracy than when the government is proposing the biggest reorganisation of local government since 1972.
